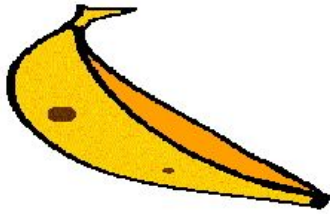
The top fundraiser from each grade will be awarded a Top Earner Certificate and a prize. The top earning class will also have a special celebration during the next Pickles & Popcorn.

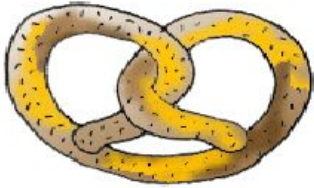

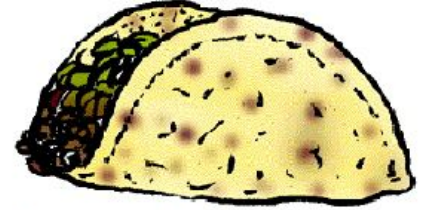
