## Mrs, Christenson, Mrs. Hill \& Mrs. Tourjee - 1st Grade:

What beautiful autumn weather. We have been reading about friends and what friends do and say to each other. We have studied the "Floss Rule" when you double the f, double the 1 , and double the s and sometimes z in a short word after a short vowel. We've talked about the long spelling of the $/ \mathrm{k} /$ sound as ck in a short word after a short vowel. Next week, we add words with beginning blends with r and s like drop and smell. The r blends can be tricky so help your child pay close attention to them in words. We have moved on to subtraction within 10. Using our number bonds helps us know what number is missing when we subtract. (7-? $=4 ; 7,3,4$.) We also use our addition facts to help with subtraction. $4+3=7 ; 7-4=3 ; 7-3=4$. Read every day! Enjoy your 3 day weekend!

2nd grade is moving through our plants and animals unit very well. The students are doing fantastic learning to use plans to assist with writing rough drafts. The Students are finally on Khan Academy for math number sense and extra practice. Yay!
