Admission of Nonresident Students

Nonresident students shall be admitted for one year at any grade level only upon recommendation of the building principal and approval of the superintendent. The following criteria shall be considered in each case where a nonresident student applies for admission to the school district:

- 1. Whether the student has attended school in the district previously and the length of time of such attendance.
- 2. Availability of space within the district for the class, program or grade level in which the student seeks to enroll.
- 3. Burdens upon school district resources caused by the student's attendance.
- 4. Academic standing and past disciplinary and attendance record of the student.
- Reasons for which the student seeks admission to the district.

Continued attendance of a nonresident student will be contingent upon proper attitude toward the school, Board policies and regulations, school rules, acceptable academic achievement and citizenship. Nonresident students not meeting these criteria may be excluded from further attendance at the discretion of the administration.

Separation of children in a family shall not be a consideration in the acceptance or admission of nonresident students.

The building principal will register nonresident students accepted by the superintendent and tentatively assign them to a class or classes on a space available basis. The response from the district to an application and tentative assignment will be made as soon as possible on the basis of enrollment projections from the previous year and/or current student enrollment. A standardized application form will be used in all cases.

An appeal of a decision can be made to the Board.
