Dear High School Counselor or Postsecondary Readiness Coordinator,

For some students, continuing their education after high school isn't guaranteed. It's not a lack of good grades that stops them from going to college or into vocational training — it's a parent's workplace injury or work-related fatality. Pinnacol Assurance, Colorado's leading provider of workers' compensation insurance, started the Pinnacol Foundation in 2000. Since then we have awarded nearly \$5 million in scholarships to over 500 students whose parents were injured or killed on the job.

As a counseling and/or postsecondary readiness professional, you may be able to help us identify students who qualify for our scholarship program. Applicants must:

- Be the child of a worker who was injured or killed in a compensable work-related accident in Colorado and who was entitled to benefits under the Colorado Workers' Compensation Act.
- Be between the ages of 16 and 25 at the time of the application deadline.
- Have and maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher.
- Have a high school diploma or GED, or be a high school senior.

Scholarships average \$4,500 per student per year, and can add up to a \$15,000 to \$20,000 investment over the course of an eligible student's undergraduate career. Scholarships may be used for may be used for four-year, two-year or trade programs at accredited colleges, universities, community colleges and vocational schools.

Applications may be submitted between November 1 and February 15 each year. For more information and to apply, visit Pinnacolfoundation.org.
